

Founded in Buffalo in 1980, the organization is governed by a Board of Directors and is licensed and regulated by the New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services (OASAS).

We offer four levels of community residential services and each of our programs is part of a total continuum of care. We take a person-centered approach to treatment so that residents receive individualized treatment and support services based on their specific circumstances.




